### Validated Self Evaluation

At the end of last term our school and Early Years and Childcare setting underwent a Validated Self Evaluation (V.S.E.) VSE is a process which aims to build the capacity of schools to evaluate their own performance and improve the quality of outcomes for learners and families. VSE involves collaboration between the school and Education Officers to enhance the school's own self-evaluation processes for continuous improvement. We were delighted with the outcome and through this process a number of key strengths were identified. These include:

- The ways in which a positive, supportive and reflective ethos of teamwork has been created
- The positive relationships, based on professional respect and challenge which enhance collaborative approaches to meeting the needs of all learners.
  Staff know their children and their families well
- The positive attitudes to learning which are shown by almost all pupils as a result of the school's commitment to children's rights and the value of respectful relationships
- The ways in which agreed actions and areas for improvement are owned by staff and learners, leading to increasing consistency of expectations and attitudes
- Transitions from Nursery to P1, from class to class and from P7 to S1 are well planned with enhanced transitions in place for those who require additional support
- The creative, confident use of digital technologies to enhance learning particularly by those children at the upper stages who find it challenging to interpret and create texts without the strategies and supports which are available
- The quality of the learning experiences in the ELC setting both indoors and outdoors offer plentiful opportunities for children to develop their curiosity, inquiry and creativity and results in children who are highly engaged in their learning within a nurturing and motivating environment.

#### Validated Self Evaluation Contd.

We will continue to:

- Embed agreed approaches to learning, teaching and assessment in all classes to ensure appropriate place and challenge for all learners
- Continue with our planned further developments of the curriculum to ensure that curriculum continues to be informed by latest and best educational thinking
- Continue to develop our skills at data analysis so that all staff can participate fully in measuring the impact of targeted interventions which have been designed to raise attainment
- In the ELC setting embed the assessment cycle in the planning process and further the use of tracking information to inform next steps in children's learning, which will enhance progress and outcomes for children
