


Staffing Updates

Primary 4 have currently been engaging with a local group called Beechbrae. Based in Blackridge they provide ecological outdoor activities for children and adults. Both classes visited the site at Beechbrae where they had the opportunity to see local produce being grown and then used this to cook a Scottish themed pasta dish. Not only did the children learn about seasonality of food but they also were given the opportunity to discuss food mile issues and the impact of these on our environment - hence the creation of a Scottish dish with limited travel of the ingredients.

In the next few weeks Primary 4 will also benefit from food technology lessons, again delivered by Beechbrae. This will help them to develop a wide range of cookery skills whilst creating recipes that focus on left over ingredients thus reducing food waste. They will work in conjunction with the Eco Committee to produce an Eco Cookery book which will be sold to friends and family to inspire local, seasonal and waste-reducing cooking. By the end of the project the children will have a strong understanding of sustainability and will be able to describe food miles and seasonality. They will also be able demonstrate a range of cookery, food hygiene and safety skills.




Water fountains
